

**Regulations of the PANIC 2026 International Conference  
(PhoBiA Annual Nanophotonics International Conference)**

**I. General Provisions**

1. These Regulations (hereinafter: the “Regulations”) apply to the PANIC 2026 International Conference (PhoBiA Annual Nanophotonics International Conference), hereinafter referred to as the “Conference”, “PANIC 2026” or the “Event”.
2. The Conference will take place 26-27 May 2026 on the Wrocław University of Science and Technology Campus, building H-14, and is organized by the Photonics and Bionanotechnology Association “PhoBiA”, operating at the Faculty of Chemistry, hereinafter the “Organizer”. Contact with the Organizer is possible via e-mail: phobia@pwr.edu.pl.
3. The purpose of these Regulations is to ensure the safety of the Conference and define the rules of conduct and usage of the Event premises.
4. The Conference is a closed event and does not constitute a mass event as defined by the Act of 23 March 2009 on the Safety of Mass Events (Dz. U. z 2015 r. poz. 2139).
5. The Conference focuses on photonics, nanotechnology, biotechnology and related fields.
6. Participation in the Event is free of charge.
7. The Conference is limited to 45 participants: max. 25 PhD students and post-docs from Wrocław University of Science and Technology or other institutions, and max. 20 bachelor’s and master’s students. Participant status is granted after completing the registration form and approval by the Organizer.
8. Invited speakers automatically receive Participant status.
9. Participants of PANIC 2026 receive a certificate of attendance.
10. Media partners may attend the Conference after informing the Organizer, but they are not classified as Participants.
11. The registration deadline is 31 March 2026, 23:59:59 CEST. Participants apply for participation in the Conference by completing the registration form available on the website <https://panic.pwr.edu.pl> and attaching the abstract of the work they intend to present.
12. Participants may withdraw from PANIC 2026 until 30 April 2026.
13. The programme of PANIC 2026 includes invited lectures, a poster session, 15-minute oral presentations and 5-minute “shotgun” presentations.
14. The Organizer provides 20 poster slots for registered Participants during the poster session, which will take place in building H-14 on 27 May 2026.
15. The Organizer may refuse entry to anyone visibly intoxicated, under the influence of substances, or violating these Regulations. A note will be filled and submitted to the H-14 reception.
16. The Organizer, or University administration staff acting on its behalf, have the right to refuse entry to the Conference to anyone disturbing public order, particularly in the manner described in point 15.
17. Participation implies acceptance of these Regulations and acknowledgement of the data protection clause.

## **II. Organizational and Safety Rules**

1. During PANIC 2026 it is forbidden to bring or distribute alcohol or any intoxicating substances; smoking, including the use of e-cigarettes, is also prohibited on the University premises.
2. In the situation that a Participant causes damage, an incident report will be drafted, and the Participant will be required to repair damage or cover the costs of the repair. In cases of intentional damage to the property, the Organizer reserves the right to immediately remove the Participant from PANIC 2026.
3. Selling, advertising or conducting any monetary collections is prohibited on the Conference premises.
4. It is forbidden to display or exhibit banners or signs containing vulgar, aggressive or hate-inciting content.
5. Any case of injury must be reported immediately to the Organizer, who will notify the appropriate services, including Emergency Medical Services, if necessary.
6. A first-aid kit is available at the reception desk of building H-14.

## **III. Rights and Obligations of Participants**

1. Registration is completed via the Conference website form <https://panic.pwr.edu.pl/>.
2. Incomplete forms or off-topic abstracts will not be considered.
3. Participants must sign the attendance list at the registration desk on the first day of PANIC 2026.
4. Lunch and coffee breaks are provided by the Organizer.
5. Travel and accommodation of invited speakers may be reimbursed by the Organizer.
6. Poster printing costs are not covered by the Organizer.
7. The Organizer is not responsible for Participants belongings.
8. Serious violations will be reported to the University authorities or, when necessary, the Police.
9. The Participant bears financial responsibility for any damage caused on the Event premises.
10. Damaging or destroying Conference signage or equipment is prohibited.
11. Registration implies acceptance of the Regulations and acknowledgement of the personal data information clause, available at the Conference registration form and website <https://panic.pwr.edu.pl/>.
12. The Organizer and media partners may record the Event. Participants who do not consent must inform the Organizer before the start of the Event.
13. Participants must follow instructions from the Organizer, University stall and Event Coordinators.
14. Participants must remain in designated areas of the Conference.
15. Each Participant is required to familiarise themselves with the Regulations and the Campus map, both available on the Conference website.
16. The Organizer is not liable for violations of these Regulations.

#### **IV. Personal Data Processing**

1. The Administrator of the personal data of the Conference Participants is Wrocław University of Science and Technology, registered at Wybrzeże Stanisława Wyspiańskiego 27, 50-370 Wrocław, Poland. In connection with registration for the Event, the following personal data may be processed: name and surname, e-mail address, telephone number, affiliation, correspondence details and information regarding specific organizational requirements (e.g., dietary preferences or accessibility needs). These data are used for the purpose of registering participation, providing organizational information and ensuring accompanying services. The data may be shared with entities providing ICT and communication services (e.g., e-mail services on behalf of the Administrator).
2. Photographs and video recordings documenting the course of the Conference may be taken. The image and voice of Participants may be captured in photographic and video materials and used by the Organizer on the Conference website as well as in informational and promotional materials.
3. The Participant who does not consent to having their image recorded must inform the Organizer before the start of the Event so that the scope of possible processing restrictions may be determined.
4. By providing personal data during registration, the Participant accepts the Regulations and should review the information clause on personal data processing. The information clause is available in the registration form and in the documents provided on the Conference website <https://panic.pwr.edu.pl/>.
5. If, for reasons beyond the Organizer's control, issuing or collecting the attendance certificate during the Conference becomes impossible, the certificate may be issued electronically within one year after the conclusion of the Event. Data necessary for issuing the certificate will be processed solely for the purpose of handling Participant requests for reissuing the document, for a period not exceeding one year after the event.

#### **V. Final Provisions**

1. The Organizer reserves the right to amend the Regulations.
2. The Organizer may cancel or reschedule the Event.
3. The Organizer reserves the right to interpret the Regulations.
4. Matters not regulated herein are subject to the Polish Civil Code.
